FOOD ASSISTANCE

A Year of Nourishing Heroes: Military & Veteran Food Distribution Impact

In 2024, Soldiers' Angels hosted impactful food distribution events in cities across the country, bringing critical support to Service Members, Veterans, and their families. These events, held in Atlanta, Charleston, Dallas, Denver, Orlando, and San Antonio, reached over 16,547 Veterans and Service Members, delivering food directly to those in need.

Through our collaboration with Kroger Racing, we also held a special, one-time event in Daytona, Florida, adding a unique element of partnership that further expanded our reach. Across all of our efforts, we proudly distributed 1,555,911 lbs. of food—a true testament to the power of community and partnership.

Each event brought together volunteers, partners, and local organizations, working through rain, snow, heat, and everything in between to ensure that every Service Member and Veteran had access to the nutritious food they deserve. From families facing financial hardship to individuals dealing with health challenges, these distributions provided a lifeline when it was needed most.

Since 2015, Soldiers' Angels has fed thousands of heroes each year, and we continue to make a lasting impact, one meal at a time.

DEPLOYED SUPPORT

Bringing Comfort to Those Who Serve Overseas

In 2024, Soldiers' Angels continued to provide vital support to our deployed Service Members, ensuring they feel connected to home and appreciated for their sacrifices. Through our dedicated volunteers and partnerships, we sent 27,938 care packages and tens of thousands of heartfelt letters to deployed Service Members, reminding them they are never alone, no matter the distance.

In addition to care packages and letters, our Angel volunteers went above and beyond, baking homemade goods to lift the

spirits of Service Members. We also extended our support to Chaplains by providing them with essential resources for their work, and to Special Operations Forces members, ensuring that those in the most challenging environments knew they were not forgotten.

Each care package, each letter, and each act of kindness reminded our heroes that no matter the distance, they are always supported, appreciated, and never alone.

VETERAN SUPPORT

Providing Compassion and Care Across the Nation

This past year, Soldiers’ Angels continued to walk alongside our nation’s Veterans, offering not just help—but hope and human connection. Our dedicated volunteers visited patients, providing not only physical items but also a comforting presence and a listening ear. These visits allowed us to connect with Veterans on a personal level, offering emotional support in addition to tangible assistance.

Through luncheons, dinners, and community gatherings, we fostered camaraderie, connection, and a true sense of belonging for our Veterans. Our efforts extended to supporting homeless Veterans and those transitioning off the streets and into stable housing. Our volunteers and partners worked tirelessly to provide the necessary resources for a successful transition.

In addition to our ongoing support, we proudly participated in 25 Stand Downs, provided 782 Housing Kits, and visited 125,411 patients in hospitals and care facilities. These efforts represent just a small part of our unwavering commitment to ensuring every Veteran feels seen, valued, and supported.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT & DISASTER RELIEF

Bringing Hope and Aid to Those Who Serve

Soldiers' Angels continued to strengthen the Military-connected Community in 2024 by directly assisting Active Duty Service Members, Guardsmen, Reservists, Veterans, and Military families across the nation. Through programs and services like Holiday Adopt-A-Family, Baby Showers, Cards of Support, and more, we fostered meaningful connections and provided essential resources to those who serve.

In addition, through our Disaster Relief program, Soldiers' Angels quickly mobilized to support Service Members, Veterans, and their families when natural disasters struck. Leveraging our vast network of volunteers, we provided 1,866 relief items worth over \$44,000—including food, clothing, bedding, and more—to those affected by the devastating Hurricanes Helene and Milton.

HOME OF THE BRAVE

Home of the Brave was established in 2012 by Peraton as a corporate social responsibility initiative. Due to the program's growth and increased interest from other partners, Peraton gifted the program to Soldiers' Angels in 2020. The campaign engages corporations and their employees in honoring and showing appreciation for

Veterans at VA medical facilities nationwide in celebration of Veterans Day. In the days leading up to or immediately following November 11, Home of the Brave volunteers organize special events, visit patients, and share their immense gratitude with Veterans. To date, the program has supported 299,815 Veterans across the country.

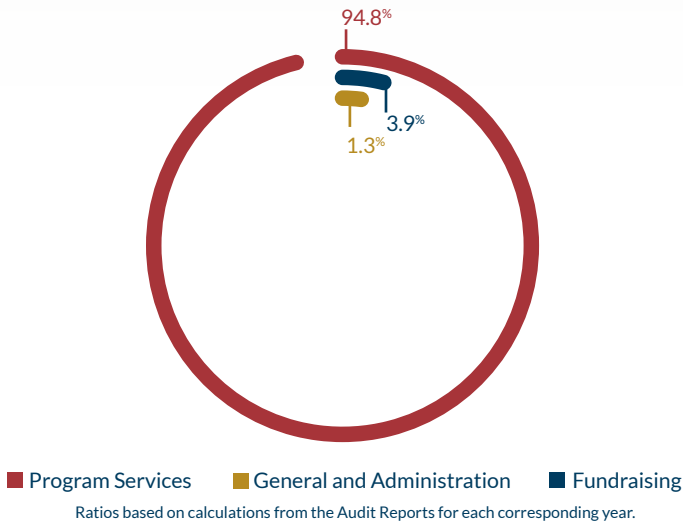

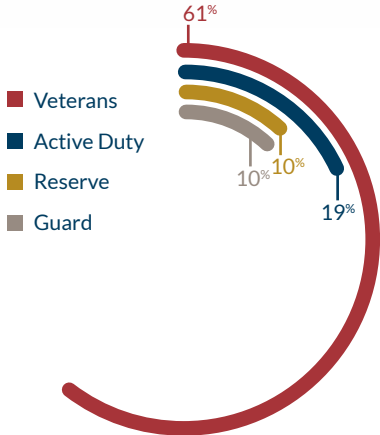

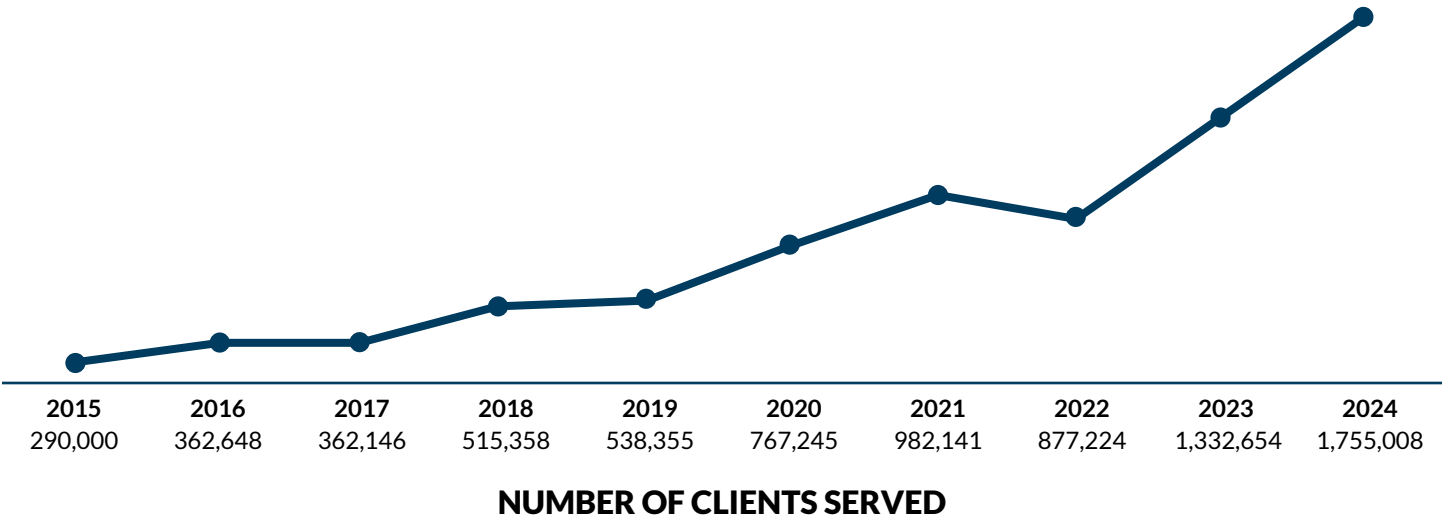


FINANCIAL IMPACT BY PROGRAM AREA

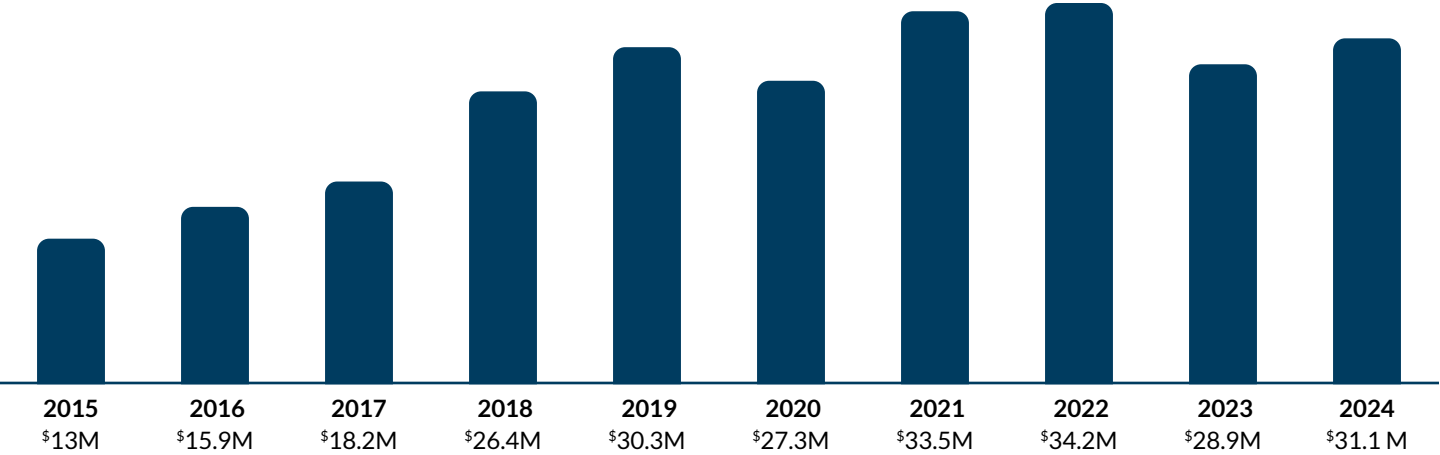
PROGRAM GROWTH BY YEAR

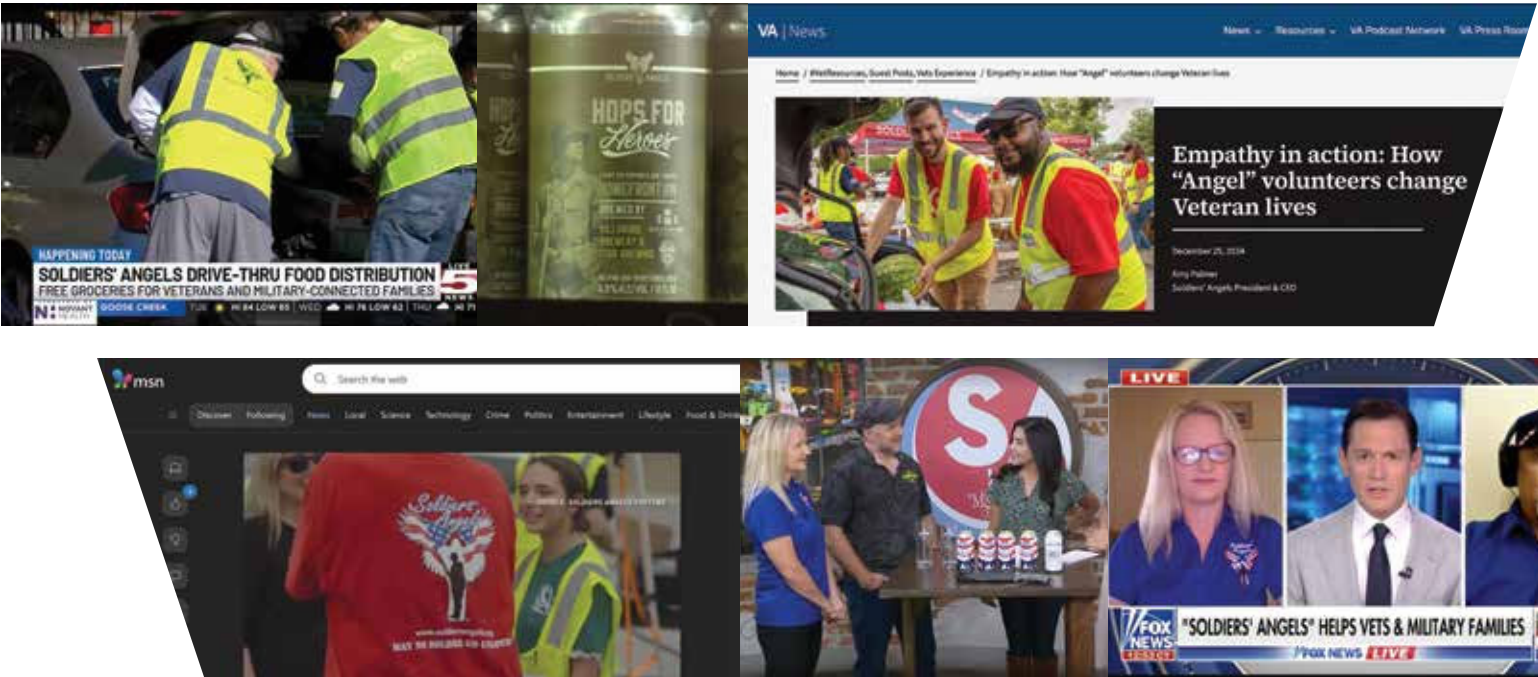
