Good day to everyone at Soldiers' Angels,

My name is Chaplain N., and my partner and I want to express our sincere thanks for all your support. During the last several months, the Angels and Donors have been an amazing source of blessing and encouragement for our troops. We have received a couple of hundred Christmas stockings, many care packages filled with hygiene items and snacks, coffee, and inspiring notes/letters.

The holidays, for many of us, did not feel quite the same for several reasons (i.e., being away from families/home, not being able to practice normal traditions, and work tempo remaining the same); however, your support allowed us to bring a ray of hope and cheer in a faraway land.

I cannot begin to express how thankful we are for how much care, time, and energy all of you put into thinking of us. We received many expressions of surprise and gratitude when we delivered these gifts. Also, we have been able to keep a couple of snack and coffee tables stocked because of you all. For context, my partner and I are serving

several hundred joint members in our immediate area and an additional several hundred personnel who are spread throughout our area of responsibility.

One moment that stuck out to me — during the delivery of some stockings to a different location on Christmas day, we came across a Sailor, whom I had met the night before, and I offered him a stocking. He was taken aback and said, "This is the only thing I received for Christmas." It meant so much to him that, later that day, I had a mutual friend mention that he told her about receiving the stocking.

I am overwhelmed by everyone's genuine care, concern, and love for our military members serving around the world. Thank you! Please share our sincere gratitude to each of the Angels and Donors who gave of their time, treasure, and talents. It made a difference in the lives of our Service Members.





Dear Soldiers' Angels Family,

As we reflect on 2025, we do so with deep gratitude and renewed confidence in what is possible when compassion, partnership, and purpose come together. This year marked a powerful moment of growth for Soldiers' Angels, one that strengthened our ability to serve and expanded the impact of our mission in meaningful ways.

With the combined efforts of our volunteers, donors, and partners, we supported 2,024,381 Military Service Members, Veterans, and their families. Behind each number is a life strengthened and a family reminded that their service and sacrifice have not been forgotten.

Our overall revenue increased because of the benevolence of our partners and supporters. Cash contributions increased by 14 percent, and in-kind support by 53 percent. The generosity of partners such as Prime, Trail's End, Girl Scouts, Books-A-Million, and food banks across the country helped fuel our programs and meet critical needs within the military-connected community. This growth represents trust in our mission, belief in our stewardship, and confidence in the promise we make to those who serve and have served, and their families.

Our vision is to champion hunger, inspire hope, and strengthen morale for Military Service Members, Veterans, and their families. This vision is more than a strategic statement. It reflects our conviction that no one who has defended this nation should face hardship alone.

With respect to the significant issue of alleviating hunger, in 2025, we expanded our food distribution efforts by opening three new Military and Veteran Food Pantries in Detroit, Charlotte, and San Antonio. These efforts were made possible through dedicated partnerships with the Detroit Pistons, the Charlotte Hornets, and Boeing. Additionally, in June, with the support and assistance of Lockheed Martin, we opened a food distribution program in Washington, D.C. By shifting toward a pantry model, we will be able to provide higher quality food, accommodate walk-up needs, and respond more effectively during emergencies, while preserving the dignity and choice of those we serve. These efforts complement our existing food distributions and strengthen our overall approach to addressing food insecurity with both efficiency and compassion.

Looking ahead, we plan to establish food pantries at all staffed Soldiers' Angels office locations across the country, which we believe will ensure consistent and reliable access to nourishment for Military and Veteran families wherever the need exists. Our focus remains on building sustainable systems that support Military Service Members and Veterans not only in moments of crisis, but over the long term.

Equally important to our development this year has been our continued investment in our volunteers nationwide, who carry out our mission with their time, commitment, and compassion. Because we recognize that our volunteers deserve the same care and reinforcement that they provide to others, we are building a stronger foundation to assist them. In 2025, as a first step, we professionalized our volunteer services, by creating staffed positions dedicated to volunteer engagement and support. Strengthening this infrastructure ensures our programs remain scalable, accountable, and positioned for responsible growth, not simply to expand our reach, but to safeguard the promise we make to every Military Service Member and Veteran who turns to us for support.

As we look ahead, we remain guided by the belief that service creates a lifelong bond. With your continued support, Soldiers' Angels is prepared to meet the evolving needs of members of the military community with our values of service, compassion, and integrity. Service requires more than gratitude. It calls us to stand beside those who have worn the uniform with action worthy of their sacrifice.

Thank you for standing with us in 2025. Your belief in our mission, partnership, and generosity strengthens the bonds of service and allows us to honor those who have worn the uniform and the families who stand beside them with care, respect, and unwavering support, honoring the sacrifices they make to protect our freedom.

FOOD ASSISTANCE

Expanding Access to Food Support Nationwide

In 2025, Soldiers' Angels stood on the front lines of the fight against food insecurity, ensuring that Service Members, Veterans, and their families felt supported, respected, and cared for. Through Military and Veteran Food Distribution events held in Atlanta, Charleston, Dallas, Denver, Orlando, and San Antonio, we delivered nourishment directly into the hands of those who needed it most — meeting immediate needs while restoring dignity with every interaction.

This year marked important growth in our mission. Soldiers' Angels opened new Military and Veteran Food Distribution sites in Cincinnati and Washington, D.C., bringing reliable support to even more Military and Veteran communities. We also launched new food pantries in Detroit, Charlotte, and San Antonio — made possible through the generous sponsorship of the

Detroit Pistons, Charlotte Hornets, and Boeing. These partnerships help provide ongoing access to nutritious food, offering stability and dignity that extends far beyond a single day of assistance.

Across all food support programs in 2025, Soldiers' Angels served 41,873 Service Members, Veterans, and Military families and distributed 1,499,800 pounds of food. Each distribution was powered by volunteers, partners, and local organizations who showed up in every condition to serve those who once stood ready to serve our nation.

As we look ahead to 2026, plans are already underway to open additional food pantries, strengthening our promise to stand with our heroes — one community and one meal at a time.

DEPLOYED SUPPORT

A Piece of Home, Sent Across the World

In 2025, Soldiers' Angels sent a piece of home across the world to our deployed Service Members, offering comfort and reassurance that even while serving far from loved ones, they are never forgotten. Through the compassion of our volunteers and the generosity of our supporters, we delivered 26,681 care packages and sent 173,590 heartfelt letters to Service Members serving far from home. Each one carried a message that cannot be measured in numbers:

Your service matters.

Your sacrifice is seen.

You are not alone.

Our **Angel volunteers** turned care into connection. Homemade baked goods offered moments of comfort during long days and quiet nights. **Chaplains** received essential resources to continue supporting the emotional and spiritual well-being of those in their care. We also extended support to **Special Operations Forces** members serving in the most demanding environments, ensuring they knew their mission and sacrifices were honored.

Every act of support strengthened a bond between those who serve and those who stand behind them, keeping home close no matter the distance.

VETERAN SUPPORT

Bringing Care, Connection, and Hope to Veterans Nationwide

Throughout the past year, Soldiers' Angels remained committed to standing beside our nation's Veterans, offering compassion, connection, and reassurance long after their service ended. Through hospital visits and care facility outreach, our volunteers provided more than essential items. They offered time, presence, and the simple comfort of being seen and heard, creating moments of connection that matter deeply.

We also brought Veterans together through luncheons, dinners, and community gatherings that fostered camaraderie, belonging, and renewed connection. Our support extended to homeless Veterans and those transitioning from the streets into stable housing, where volunteers and partners worked tirelessly to provide resources, encouragement, and hope during life-changing moments.

In addition, Soldiers' Angels participated in 21 Stand Downs, provided 459 Housing Kits, and visited 119,485 Veterans in hospitals and care facilities. Each effort reflects our unwavering commitment to honor service with dignity, compassion, and care, ensuring every Veteran knows they are valued and never forgotten.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT & DISASTER RELIEF

Standing Together When It Matters Most

In 2025, Soldiers' Angels continued to strengthen Military communities by standing beside active duty Service Members, Guardsmen, Reservists, Veterans, and Military families across the nation. Through programs such as Holiday Adopt-A-Family, Baby Showers, Cards of Support, and other outreach initiatives, we provided essential resources while fostering connection, reassurance, and a sense of belonging for those who serve and sacrifice.

When disaster struck, Soldiers' Angels responded with urgency and compassion. Through our Disaster Relief program, we mobilized quickly to support Service Members, Veterans, and their families impacted by natural disasters, including the devastating Hill Country flooding in Texas and the Los Angeles wildfires. As communities faced uncertainty and loss, we came together to ensure that rescue and recovery teams had the essential items they needed to carry out their mission, while also delivering 42,626 relief items including food, clothing, bedding, and other critical supplies to affected Military and Veteran families. In total providing support valued at over \$170,300. Powered by our nationwide volunteer network, our response reflected the strength, speed, and solidarity of those committed to serving the Military community in times of greatest need.

Whether during moments of celebration or times of crisis, Soldiers' Angels remained committed to showing up, offering hope, and ensuring no Military family faces hardship alone.

Mobilizing Together with USAA

Through our partnership with USAA, we were able to rapidly expand our disaster response efforts. In less than 1 hour, USAA employees packed 700 hygiene kits and 700 non-perishable box lunches for distribution in Kerrville following the Hill Country flooding, demonstrating how corporate partnership and volunteer spirit come together to meet urgent needs.





A Tradition of Honoring Those Who Served

In 2025, Soldiers' Angels continued the Home of the Brave program as a powerful expression of national gratitude, bringing appreciation directly to Veterans receiving care in VA medical facilities across the country. Established in 2012 and entrusted to Soldiers' Angels in 2020, Home of the Brave engages corporations and their employees in honoring Veterans in deeply personal ways during the days surrounding Veterans Day.

Through this program, volunteers organized meaningful events, visited patients, and delivered much-needed items to Veterans, many of whom were far from home or facing difficult health challenges. Each visit offered more than supplies—it offered recognition, conversation, and the reassurance that their service is remembered and honored.

Since its inception in 2012, Home of the Brave has honored more than **317,000 Veterans nationwide** through the generosity of corporate partners and volunteers who have contributed **57,859 hours** of service and generated more than **\$2,726,558 in donations** for VA facilities. 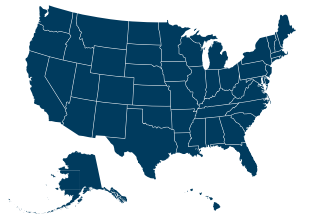

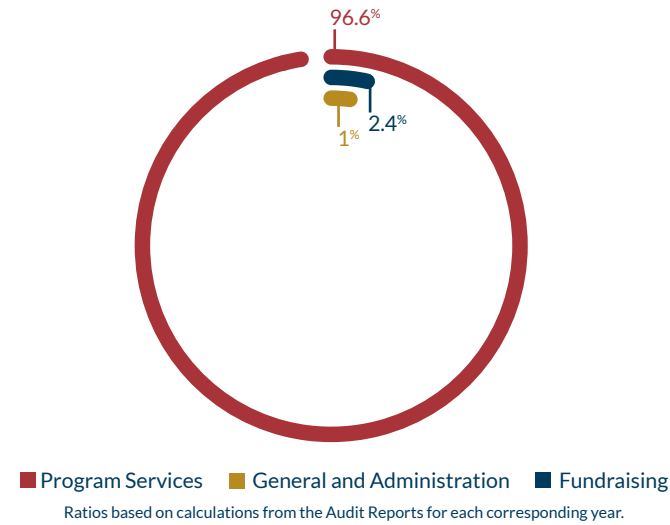

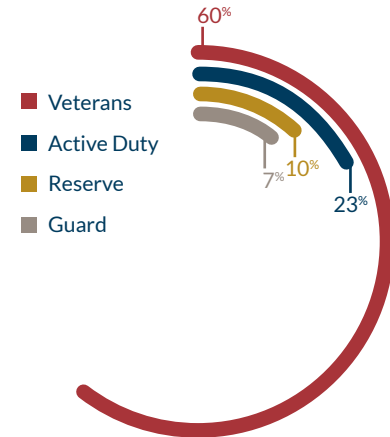

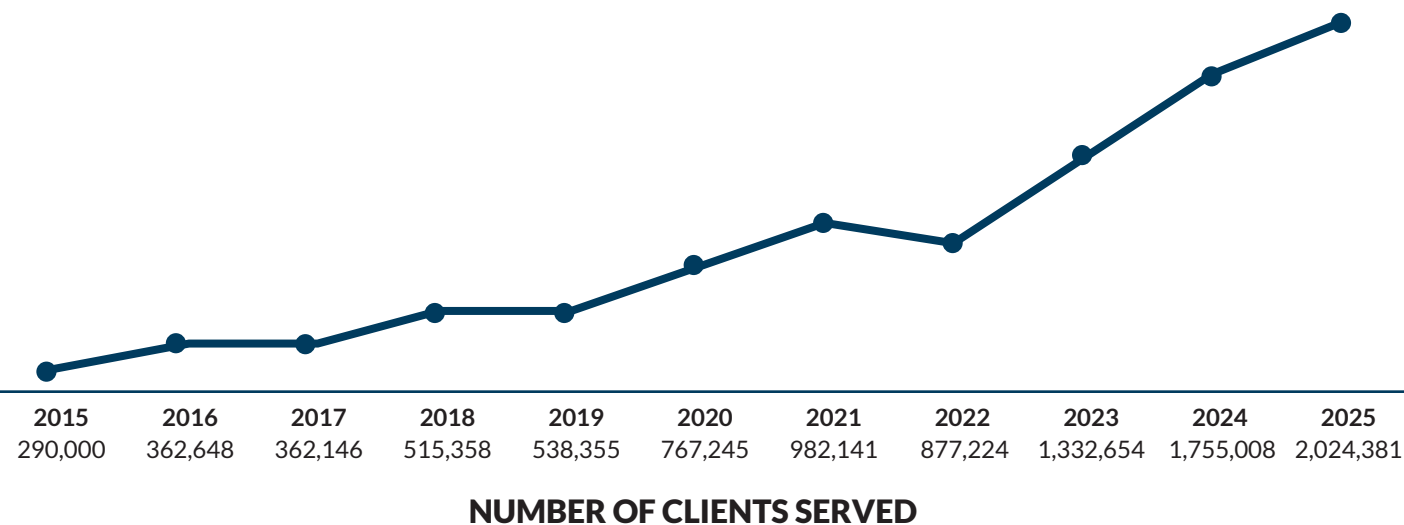

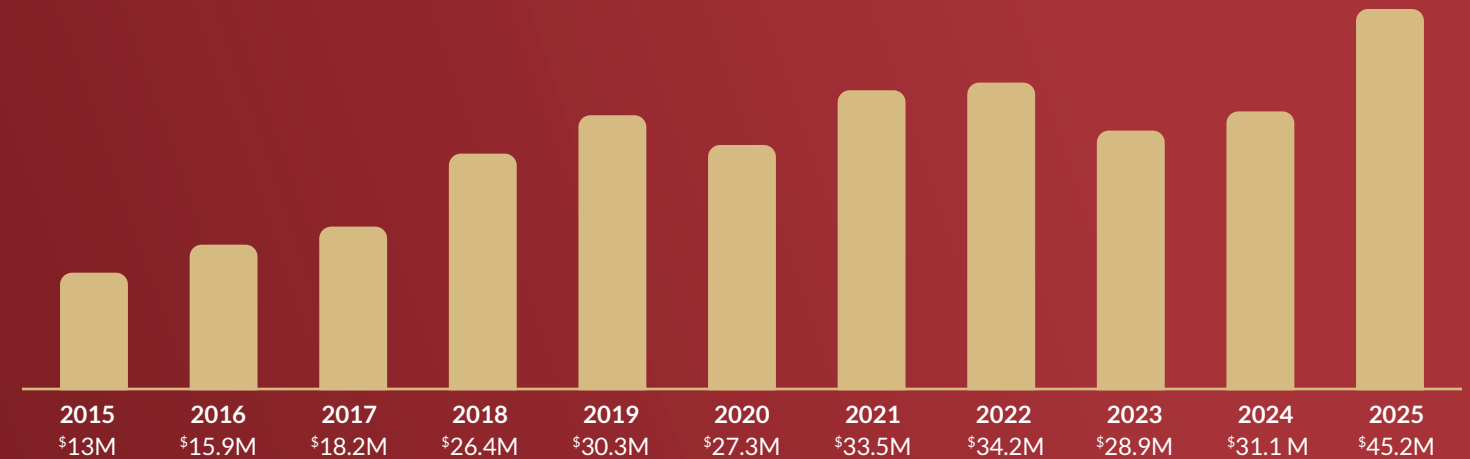

KEVIN'S STORY

At our inaugural Washington, D.C. Military and Veteran Food Distribution, we experienced a moment we will never forget.

A Veteran approached the event on an electric bicycle, towing a small wagon behind him. As he neared, several of us grew concerned. How would he manage the busy streets of D.C. with a wagon full of groceries behind a bike?

We asked gently.

With a smile and unshakable confidence, he replied, "I've done a whole lot more with a whole lot less. I'll be fine." That moment captured the attention of every volunteer nearby.

As he made his way through the distribution line, he struck up conversations, radiating warmth with his bright personality and infectious smile. Before he left, we caught up with him and asked if he would be willing to share his story on camera for a video we were filming. He lit up at the invitation, clearly at ease in front of an audience.

His name was Kevin.

He proudly shared that he served in the U.S. Marine Corps for four years in the early 2000s. Life after service had not been easy. He experienced homelessness for several years

and now lives with his mother while working to support both her and his fiancée. The groceries he received that day, he told us, would make a real difference.

Then we asked a deeper question.

"What do you wish more people, especially younger generations, understood about the challenges Veterans face after service?"

Kevin's expression changed. Tears welled in his eyes. He paused for a long time, visibly struggling to find the words. Then, his voice trembling, he said:

"I wish they understood that when they tell us we're crazy because of how we behave after our time in combat, it hurts. It feels like a dagger hearing those words and knowing the things I've gone through. All I wanted to do was serve and protect my family and my country. But now, that seems forgotten because all they see are the struggles I deal with."

There was not a dry eye among us.

When the camera stopped rolling, Kevin broke down in deep, body-shaking sobs. Years of pain and isolation poured out. We placed a hand on his shoulder, offered him a tissue, and sat down on the curb beside him. We did not speak. We simply sat with him as he let it all out.



Finally, we asked, "Would you like to talk about it?" Something shifted in him, like a weight being lifted. It was as if simply being asked was enough to open a long-closed door.

He told us about his life. A rough childhood filled with situations at home that he has clearly spent a lifetime trying to forget. Being bullied at school for being the "ugly kid." Joining the Marines became his escape and his purpose.

He spoke about his dreams, his love of writing, gardening, and music. He hopes to become "YouTube famous" for the music he mixes and is working with the VA to pursue a certificate in Music Theory. His dream is to save enough money to buy a keyboard that can do everything he needs so he can spread joy to others through music.

And we listened.

For ten, maybe twenty minutes, we simply listened. Around us, the event continued. Cars moved through the line. Volunteers distributed food. But for that window of time, nothing else mattered.

By the end, Kevin looked different. Calmer. Lighter. More at peace. He thanked us again and again, not just for the food that filled his wagon, but for listening.

It struck us then that the answer to that powerful question, what do you wish more people understood about the challenges Veterans face after service, is actually simple.

Listen.

Listen to their stories.

Listen to their hopes.

Listen to their pain.

Yes, action is undeniably important to create change. But sometimes, the most meaningful thing we can offer is stillness, presence, and an open heart.

We may never know if that moment helped Kevin in the long run. But we truly hope it moved him one step forward in his healing journey.
